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PREFERRED ZONES

Zone X (previously C)

Flood insurance is not required by federal mortgage programs for preferred zones. These are areas determined to be outside the 500-year floodplain and determined to be outside the 1% and .2% annual chance floodplains.

ZONE B, X500

Areas of 500-yr flood; areas of 100yr flood with avg. depths of less than 1 foot or with drainage areas less than 1 sq mile and areas protected by levees from 100-yr flood. An area inundated by .2% annual chance flooding.

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding (usually sheet flow on sloping terrain) for which average depths have been determined. Flood depths range from 1 to 3 feet.

UNDES

An area of undesignated flood hazard. A body of open water, located within a community's jurisdictional limits, that has no defined flood hazard.

100IC

An area where the 1% annual chance flooding is contained within the channel banks and the channel is too narrow to show to scale. BFEs are not shown in this area (1% Annual **Chance Flood Discharge Contained** in Channel).

ZONE A

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding, for which no BFEs have been determined.

An area inundated by flooding, for which BFEs or average depths have been determined. This is an area that was previously, and will again, be protected from the 1% annual chance flood by a Federal flood protection system whose restoration is Federally funded and underway.

ZONE VE

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding with velocity hazard (wave action); BFEs have been determined.

5001C

An area where the 0.2% annual chance flooding is contained within the channel banks and the channel is too narrow to show to scale. (2% **Annual Chance Flood Discharge** Contained in Channel).

ZONE AE

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding, for which BFEs have been determined.

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding, for which BFEs have been determined.

ZONE V(1-30)

Coastal flood with velocity hazard (wave action); BFEs have not been determined.

ZONE V

special flood hazard extending from offshore to the inland limit of a primary frontal dune along an open coast and any other area subject to high velocity wave action from storms or seismic sources. All buildings be elevated on piles or columns.

ZONE AH

An area inundated by 1% annual chance flooding (usually an area of ponding), for which BFEs have been determined. Flood depths range from 1-3 feet.

An area of undetermined but possible flood hazards.

An area where the floodway is contained within the channel banks and the channel is too narrow to show to scale. BFEs are not shown in this area (Floodway contained in channel).

CBRA

Coastal High Hazard Area. An area of Coastal Barrier Resource Act was established to encourage conservation of hurricane prone, biologically-rich coastal barriers. CBRA zones are ineligible for federal programs or assistance including the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).
